It is with deep sorrow that we announce the passing of Billy Sim Sullivan Sisler. She was the fifth child born to Charley Jackson Sullivan and Gladys Tedford Sullivan. She entered this world in the family home in Nashville, Arkansas, on April 21, 1941, and passed peacefully at the age of 84 on November 19, 2025, in Hot Springs.
