Edith P. Shively of Hot Springs, Arkansas died Sunday, December 19, 2010.

Mrs. Shively was born in Winterburn, West Virginia to the late John and Catherine Hockman.

She was a graduate of the Ohio State University School of Nursing and spent time in Des Moines, Iowa teaching at Broadlawn General Hospital. She then taught nursing in Canton, Ohio and was later employed as a chemist at Barium Stainless Steel.

As a result of war time need for woman to enter a number of technical fields, Edith secured a position as a chemical engineer with the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company in Akron, Ohio. She was the first woman to be a senior compounder in development, specializing in vulcanization. Edith worked at five Goodyear plants abroad, and four in the United States where she was a trouble-shooter and trainer. She retired after 31 years of service.

Mrs. Shively relocated to Hot Springs, Arkansas where she enjoyed an active lifestyle which included boating, swimming, biking, golfing and hiking.

Edith Shively was predeceased by husband William B. Shively, sister Gladys V. Fisher, and brothers L. Page Hockman and Ralph W. Hockman. Survivors include four nieces and three nephews.
