Elizabeth Ann Brasher, 92, of Hot Springs, passed away peacefully at home on Friday, August 28, 2020, with family present. She is now in heaven with our Heavenly Father, face-to-face with the Lord Jesus Christ, and happily reunited with her wonderful husband, Bill, and with other family members and friends, who were also saved by believing in the Lord Jesus Christ. Elizabeth, or "Liz," was born on November 3, 1927, in Crossett, Arkansas, to Edwin Campbell and Anna Bradberry. Anna was from the Wheat family of Monticello, Arkansas. Elizabeth grew up in Monticello with her loving grandparents, Beldon and Ella Wheat.

As a young woman of 17 she met the first love of her life, Sidney Marshall Cook, Jr., of Haynesville, Louisiana. They married and lived in family housing at Ouachita State University in Arkadelphia, Arkansas, where he was a young professor on staff and she was a student. She eventually graduated with a degree in English and a minor in history and then they moved to Houston to start a family. Prior to having children, Elizabeth taught elementary school children in the 3rd grade.

Elizabeth and Sidney had two sons in Houston, Greg Cook of San Diego and Doug Cook of Honolulu. Sidney passed away a few years after they arrived in Houston and Elizabeth found herself raising two young boys by herself.

Elizabeth is also survived by one granddaughter, Anne Marie Cook, of San Antonio, Texas, and by her brother's family in Fayetteville, Arkansas. Her brother was Edwin Bradberry and passed several years ago.

Eventually the Lord sent Bill Brasher, who turned out to be the second love of Elizabeth's life. He was a wonderful Christian husband. They would have been married 47 years had Bill not passed away three years ago.
