Gerald “Jerry” Willis, 86, of Hot Springs died on Friday, August 31, 2012 at home. He was born July 26, 1926 to the late Maude Tipps Willis and William Willis in Springfield, Illinois.

Jerry was a U.S. Army veteran of WWII receiving a Bronze Battle Star and a Good Conduct Medal. After serving his country, Jerry went to work for the Springfield, Illinois Police Department where he served for 26 years, retiring as a detective sergeant having received numerous commendations to include several of the prestigious “William Herndon Awards” for the most distinguished acts performed by a plain clothes officer. He was predeceased by his parents and his wife, Hilde Willis.
