Jeffrey James, 50, of Hot Springs passed away Monday February 2, 2015. He was born August 31, 1964 to Mabel Carter James and Fabern Carl James in Hot Springs.

Jeff was a Sigma Nu at the University of Arkansas where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in Biology. He became a Science Teacher, teaching at Fountain Lake School, and earned a master's degree in education. He was of the Methodist faith. He was predeceased by his mother, Mabel James.

Jeff loved his students, his friends, his family and his dog, Jesse James.

Survivors include his father, Fabern C. James & his stepmother, Theda James; one sister, Jann James Gibson; one niece, Rainey Gibson and one nephew, Caleb James Gibson.

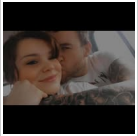

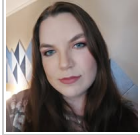

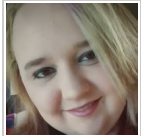
