He loved sports of any kind. On their 1st date he took his wife to a 40 and over baseball tournament. They were married on a baseball field. He coached not only his own but many children in baseball. Then he coached his grandchildren, for a few years. He was one of two people who started the Traveling baseball team at the Liberty County Recreational Dept in Hinesville, Ga. He was also a High School Basketball referee. He coached baseball at Majestic Park for three years.
