Kathryn A. Roberts, 72, of Hot Springs, graduated from this life on April 21, 2024. She built a legacy out of her love for teaching and inspiring her family, friends and her students.

She was predeceased by her parents, Herbert Morris Cook and Elizabeth Ann Zinn.

Her survivors include; daughter, Ragan Roberts; sons, Rhett Roberts (Cris) and Rory Roberts (Sandi); brother, Brad Cook; sisters, Dawn Waddle and Kim Navalance; beloved grandchildren, Drew, Declan, Chloe and Reese and numerous nieces and nephews.

After graduating from Lakeside High School in 1969, Kathey earned her BSE and MSE at Henderson State University. In 1988, she was awarded the Presidential Award for Excellence in Science and Math Teaching, the highest recognition that a kindergarten through 12th grade science, technology, engineering, or mathematics teacher may receive for outstanding teaching in the United States. In 2006, Kathey was honored to receive the Arkansas Excellence in Education Award and went on to be named the South Central Regional recipient of Excellence in Education Award having been chosen from 6 states. She was a proud member of Alpha Delta Kappa, an international organization for women educators. She participated in the Arkansas Epsilon Chapter where she served as President for two terms. She attended many regional and international ADK conferences and conventions around the U.S. Ms. Roberts taught Biology and other sciences at Lakeside High School from

1976 until her retirement in 2010. During her teaching career she was active in numerous activities and competitions including Future Problem Solving, Robotics and Olympics of the Mind where she won numerous state competitions including an international victory as well. She was a long-time member and former officer of the Lakeside Alumni Association. She was also a member and former secretary of Garland County Retired Teachers Association.

Before it became a trend, Kathey pioneered the use of adaptive technologies for students with disabilities, enabling them to engage in hands-on learning experiences. Students with paralysis, muscle memory problems or confined to a wheelchair, were provided the opportunity to learn aside with the other students. Kathey spearheaded the establishment of Lakeside High's inaugural greenhouse and successfully secured multiple funded grants to enhance her students' understanding of the science.

Besides her pride in her children and her 4 grandchildren, Kathey enjoyed spending time with her running buddies, Kaye White and Rachel Shankles. Together they made many memories. Traveling to Branson or Florida, meeting to share long lunches at local restaurants or cooking at The Wharf. The Three Amigos were BFF's and have the tee shirts to prove it.

Kathey's life and legacy will be celebrated on May 19th at Arc Isle, 203 Lookout Point, Hot Springs, AR 71913. The service will be officiated by Mike Pounders at 1:00 pm followed by a Celebration of Life. Friends and former students are welcome to attend.

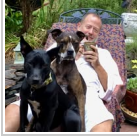
