Kelvin Trumane “KT” Marshall, 51, of Hot Springs, Arkansas, passed away Monday, November 3, 2025, surrounded by his loving family. Born on April 29, 1974, to Theodore and Charlene Marshall, KT was the youngest of three children. Kelvin accepted Christ at a very early age. He was a faithful member of the Woodridge Street Church of Christ, where he served as the Finance Director and Church Announcer. He was always willing to help out and serve others. Kelvin loved his Church Family! During his high school years at Hot Springs High School, KT was a star athlete who excelled at football. He earned a bachelor’s degree with a major in Finance from the University of Central Arkansas. After graduating from college, he started his first job as a bank auditor for the State of Arkansas. This led to a twenty-one-year career in banking at Malvern National Bank. His current position was Vice President at the Hot Springs branch. KT built a foundation of trust with every customer he came in contact with and could reach people in a very rare, vulnerable, and profound way. KT developed a love of sports at a young age, which led to his passion for refereeing. He was a pillar of the community who touched the lives of many youth and their parents with his profound warmth, generosity, and outgoing personality. He had the ability to connect with just about anyone. His legacy has left a significant, positive impact on his community. KT was the kind of man who made excellence look effortless. A sharp dresser (Polo by Ralph Lauren was his uniform), a respected executive, a referee who knew the game and the spirit behind it, a philanthropist who gave generously, and a

mentor who lifted others as he climbed. He was a Trojan High School legend and die-hard Dallas Cowboys fan. His athleticism was matched by his heart, and his presence made every room brighter, every gathering richer (his stories would have us shaking our heads, laughing hysterically, and pondering how this tale would end)! Of all KT's accomplishments, his love and commitment to his family are by far his greatest legacy. He was always the first to rally everyone together during the holidays. He enjoyed planning family vacations, playing spades and dominoes all night long, and the friendly competitions with his nephews playing "College Football" on PlayStation. KT was the center and anchor of his family. He was a devoted son, a loving brother, and the kind of uncle who blurred the lines between "Uncle Buck" and father. His house and office walls are full of photos of his nieces and nephews and all their accomplishments. He cheered them on for every sporting event, dance recital, and graduation. This past year, he was able to witness his nephew who carries his name become Dr. Keyan Trumane Marshall, M.D. The look of pride on his face was unmatched. The recent births of his "honorary granddaughters" brought joy to him in his final months. KT had two extra siblings by marriage that shared a special bond with him. The word "in-law" did not exist to him when it came to his love and affection for them. KT was more than just a baby brother to his two older siblings. He was their best friend, confidant, and the driving force that gave them strength to pursue greatness. The three of them share childhood adventures and intimate stories with a bond that is unbreakable. He was their sounding board, safe place, and their constant check-in. There was no mountain high enough that he wouldn't have climbed for them. The love he displayed for his siblings was shown truly at the onset of his illness when he told them what his diagnosis was. With a calm and consoling strength, he selflessly stated, "I do not have children, and if this was to happen to any of us, I am glad it was me." His devotion to his mother was a testament to her unwavering love. This unwavering devotion was a reflection of her selfless acts, resilience, and the unconditional love she consistently showed him throughout his life. His mother was the center of his

world, and she never left his side through his recent battle. KT's love of family was rooted in the strong and steady presence of his father. At a young age, his father became his most devoted fan. His voice echoed in the stands at high school football games. Like his father, KT was never at a loss for words. He spoke to others from his heart. Every Sunday, you could find the two of them together enjoying a mutual love of sports, especially the Dallas Cowboys. KT was truly a gift, woven into the fabric of all the lives he touched. His presence will be greatly missed and will leave a lasting void. KT is survived by his parents, Theodore and Charlene Marshall; one brother, Ted (Cindy) Marshall Jr., Toledo, Ohio; one sister, Claudia (Ricky) Westbrook Sr., Maumelle, AR; four nephews, Theodore III, Keyan, Kendal, and Ricky Jr.; and two nieces, Makaila and Raquel. A host of aunts, uncles, and cousins genuinely loved him.
