Lola I. Reed, 91, of Hot Springs passed away Wednesday January 4, 2012. She was born October 1, 1920 in Hempstead County, Sardis Community of Nashville, AR. She was predeceased in death by her father and mother, J.E. and Beatrice Reed, and her two sisters, Anita and Nona Reed.

Ms. Reed was a graduate of Nashville High School and local business college. She was formerly employed as a legal secretary with Steel & Steel Law Office and also served as a court reporter. She moved to Hot Springs, AR in March of 1955 and began employment as a medical secretary for the former Wade Clinic with Ralph M. Patterson, M.D. and George J. Fotioo, M.D. She was a member of First United Methodist Church, in Hot Springs since 1962; a member of the Mort Cox Sunday School Class (formerly the Searchers Class), serving as vice-president; a member of the Chancel Choir of First United Methodist Church; she has served on the Board of Stewards for the church; the Councils on Ministries and the Outreach Committee (formerly Work Area on Missions and Social Concerns), where she served as secretary for approximately 20 years. She was a devoted member of the Intercessory Prayer Team; a member of XYZ (eXtra Years of Zest) and she volunteered at Soul Food Cafe where she always greeted everyone with a smile. She was also a member of Pilot Club of Hot Springs, where she served as president in 1966 and 1980. A member of Century Club of Hot Springs, and served as president for three consecutive years.

She is survived by numerous cousins, including Reuben Reed and Marine

Kennedy, of Nashville, AR and Cindy and Larry Dewitt and Tiah and Michael Frazier all of Hot Springs.

Memorial services will be 2:00 PM Saturday at First United Methodist Church with Reverend Bud Reeves officiating.
