Mary Inez Hoyle "Jackie" Cooper went to be with her Lord and Savior on March 30, 2016. Jackie was born to Bernie and Esther Hoyle on December 23, 1930 in Poteau, Oklahoma. She graduated from Poteau High School in 1948, and went to Hot Springs to attend St. Joseph's Training School for nurses. While there, she met Don B Cooper, fell in love, and married the love of her life on December 26, 1950. Don and Jackie lived in various places around the US and Canada during Don's career with Mobil Oil Corporation. While in Denver, she completed her LPN degree and served as a nurse in the cancer ward.

Jackie and Don retired to Hot Springs in 1988. Jackie became active at Oaklawn United Methodist Church, and attended and volunteered there faithfully. She was a constant member of the Mary Clifton Sunday School class. She loved the youth of the church, had an ever-ready smile for them and is famous for the brownies she made for their events.
