May 30, 1916 - September 17, 2017

Katherine Nadine Gibbs Lotz went to be with her Lord on September 17, 2017. Nadine was born on May 30, 1916 in Clovis, New Mexico and moved back to Hot Springs with her parent and siblings 3 months later. She resided in Hot Springs for 101 years. Nadine was predeceased by her husband of 64 years, H. Crandall Lotz, and her parents, Ira R Gibbs and Clara Norwood Graham Gibbs. She was also predeceased by her nine siblings: Idelle Gibbs Brooks, Bill Gibbs, Sally Gibbs Ramoly, John Gibbs, Fred Gibbs, Jimmy Gibbs, Doris "Perky" Gibbs Elam, Aneetha Gibbs, and Janice Gibbs Watts.

She and Crandall loved traveling with their family all over the United States and after retirement to Europe and Hawaii.
