“ You never know what an impact someone will make on you - Mr. Crudup had that impact on me, and he never knew it. I was a shy eleven-year-old from the west coast who had the wrong pants, the wrong hair, and the wrong skin color to fit in on Mr. Crudup's bus. It was 1981, and I was one of the only white kids on his route. I got on the bus that first day and as I walked down the aisle every stare said "This seat's taken." I had nowhere to go.

Mr. Crudup turned off the music, which he always played at full volume to drown out the kids (I still remember the song - "More Bounce to the Ounce" by Zapp) and everyone got quiet. "We ain't gonna be like that, y'all... this young man needs a place to sit."

And so his bus, 'The BlueBird,' sat there motionless until someone offered me a seat - a shy girl who would later become one of my best friends.

A black man, refusing to move his bus until the white kid was given a seat - a kind of Rosa Parks in reverse, I later came to recognize, except this time HE was the hero. Mr. Crudup stood up for me that day. When I saw his obituary in the paper, that memory came flooding back. I had to share it.

After that morning, whenever it was available, I sat in the seat right behind the driver and shouted at him over Rick James, The Gap Band, or Carl Carlton. He was a friend to me when I desperately needed one. That was forty years ago, and I STILL REMEMBER THE SONG THAT WAS PLAYING.

You never know what an impact someone will make on you, when kindness will make all the difference.

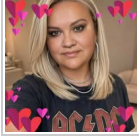
