



## Dr. Otho Lee Trick

August 4, 1931 - December 15, 2022

A Celebration of Life was held on May 13 for Dr. Otho Lee Trick. He was born on August 4, 1931 in Anderson, Indiana. He passed away in Hot Springs, AR on December 15, 2022 at 91 years old. Lee was preceded in death by his parents, Homer and Juanita (Turner) Trick, His Wife, Reita Troum and his son, David Trick, His brother, Virgil and sisters Mona Lasure, Laura Atkinson. One month from his passing his close and special Sister in Law, Midge Trick (Virgil) passed away at the age of 96. He is survived by his special lifelong friend and childhood sweetheart, Sara Lawler Umphers and her Family, His Children, Kevin Trick, Brian Trick, and Cynthia Trick Drapela, Drs. Jim and Carol Shoot. His close friends from Houston TX, Greg and Charlotte Sullivan, their daughter Sarah, Joe Dugan and Brenda Bowers, He also leaves behind many Grandchildren, nieces, nephews and friends.

Lee attended pre medical school in 1950 at Anderson College and then graduated from Indiana University in 1954. In 1958 he graduated with his Doctor of Medicine degree from Indiana University School of Medicine. In 1967, he finished his Psychiatry Residency at DUKE University. He served as a Licensed Physician in Indiana, New Mexico, West Virginia, Texas, and North Carolina.

In his "Free" Time he also earned his private Pilot Licenses and Various computer technology Certifications.

Lee received many honors during his lifetime. One of his greatest honors was received in 1970 when he was selected as an outstanding teacher by the Senior Class at West Virginia School of medicine. Most recently in 2021, he was presented with the Albert Nelson Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award. He was extremely honored to have served as Physician Surveyor for the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations from 1990-2000.

Lee was such a Joy to be around and was loved by all who knew him.
