Rena Lou Elliott, 87, a life long resident of Hot Springs died on Friday, December 10, 2010 in Hot Springs. She was born on November 4, 1923 in the Upper Park Ave. area to Ernest Disheroon and Rena Bentz Disheroon, descendents of pioneer families of Hot Springs. She was a graduate of Hot Springs High School, Class of 1941 and attended Hendrix College. She worked in the treasurer's office of the Army-Navy General Hospital during WWII before marrying H. G. Elliott, Jr. She was retired owner and operator of Elliott Butane Company and recently retired from the Shouffle Boutique. A lifetime member of the First United Methodist Church, a Sunday School teacher for over 15 years, former choir member, past member of the Board and Commission on Education, Secretary and long time member of the Altar Guild, a lifetime member of the Hot Springs Jr. Auxiliary, and a past member of the Pilot Club of Hot Springs.
