Early Friday morning, May 4, 2012, Rosalie Virginia Cudd Scott passed away at the age of 94, the last of her 8 brothers and sisters to leave this world. Rose was born August 21, 1917 to Charles and Suzie Cudd of Wynne, Arkansas. In 1947, she married Harry Lehman Scott and together they raised their children. Rose was a dedicated housewife and mother, but she also contributed to her family by attending cosmetology school and making a living as a beautician and saleswoman. She was an active member of the Jonesboro St. Mark's Episcopal Church and was active in the Altar Guild.

Later in life, Rose moved to Hot Springs where she established herself as a true community leader. On any given day, she could be found volunteering for the Salvation Army, serving the Democratic Party and Democratic Women's League, hosting dinners for the local Audobon Society, or winning trophies at the Bridge House, her favorite pastime. She avidly supported Bill Clinton and played an integral role in securing funds to refurbish the Hot Springs Memorial Field Airport several years ago.

Rose is survived by two sons, Charles Scott of Dallas, TX, and Michael Scott (Rickie) of Cape Girardeau, MO; step-son Harry Scott, Jr. (Anna Jean) of Jonesboro; grandchildren Kristen (Kurt) of Fayetteville, Chalee of Hot Springs, Laura (Sam) of Little Rock, and Libby, Jimmy, Janet, Lynn, and John, all of Jonesboro; and many great-grandchildren.

Rose's philosophy of life was to always be positive, grateful for life's blessings, and accepting of its trials. Her giving spirit was evident in her philanthropy and

giving in the name of her Christian spirituality.
