Dragomir "Volly" Vuletic, 91, of Hot Springs passed away, Thursday, December 16, 2010. He was born October 16, 1919 in Serbia to the late Milojka Bogdanovic Vuletic and Bosko Vuletic. He was a retired Prosthetic Device maker in Chicago. During WWII he was in the Yugoslavian Army called the Chetniks under the command of General Draza Mihilovic, who were fighting for a free Yugoslavia. He was part of the battalion with his officer Kalagic that saved over 450 paratroopers. If it was not for the chetniks the American paratroopers would not have survived. He was also a member of St. Michael Archangel Serbian Orthodox Church. Predeceased by his parents; brother, Dragisa Vuletic and sister Dusanka Jerinic Survivors include his wife; Cvijeta Vuletic of Hot Springs, one brother, Bogdan Vuletic of Yugoslavia and several nieces and nephews.
